Build Stoves in Guatemala Nov 7-16

The CCC (Community Compassion Corps of CUCC) is offering a work week in San Lucas Toliman (a small village around Lake Atitlan) where we will be building fuel efficient woodburning stoves with outside ventilation for Mayan women and their families who will be helping us. In addition, this service/learning project led by Transformational Journeys will include cultural talks every evening and a boat tour visiting other villages around the Lake. Dates are: Nov. 7-16. Cost is \$1800, which includes airfare, lodging, food. and internal transportation. The costs are tax deductible. 50th Anniversary Celebration Update

We are only two months away from our big 50th anniversary celebration weekend August 23rd and 24th. Here's what we have achieved in our Jubilee Year thus far:

- On January 26, 2014, our church celebrated the actual anniversary date of the 1st service of Southern Hills United Church in 1964 in a home in Martin Park. A historical brochure was created in honor of that event.
- Our choir sang a special anthem on Easter Sunday and will do an encore performance on August 24th.
- On May 4th, Jean Scott delivered a special sermon as a guest who served us a former interim pastor (2001) and as our Pastoral Associate (2002-2013).
- Our CCC commission organized a native seed collection volunteer opportunity in June.

Several projects are in the planning stages. It's not too late for you and/or your commission to propose an idea of your own.

- The youth are creating a time capsule to be buried after the August 24th service.
- Liz Tilton is working with Diane Martin to publish a book featuring the banners and other art of the church. It will be available for purchase.
- Art Wainwright and Barbara Willis are creating a video slide show of historical photos to be viewed during the celebrations in August.
- Taizé organizers will lead a 10:00 service, incorporating their prayer practice with our entire community.
- Former pastors Phil Campbell (1982-1986) and Malcolm Himschoot as well as Harriott Quin, ordained minister, have been invited to fill the pulpit during the remainder of the year. Phil will preach on August 24th.
- Kirsten Boyer has offered her professional services to photograph our entire congregation after the service on August 24th as a gift to our CUCC community.
- Tim Brown is composing an anthem in honor of our 50th, sponsored by several members who bid on the idea at the November fundraiser.
